Who did he beat? Who was the driver? How fast did they go? What's his breeding? For the answers look to the past performance pages of the track program. It all might look intimidating at first, but this page will show you how to use the wealth of data supplied for each horse.

HARNESS POWER NUMBERS

The harness power is a calculation that takes various factors in a horse's past performance lines over last 10 starts and creates a power number based on that criteria. In theory, the higher the power number the better suited the horse is for that particular race. The power number calculates the following data: pace, class, number of starters, stretch and finish calls.
